

INFANT EXAM – SIX MONTHS

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DEVELOPMENT:

- 1. Sits unsupported (6-7 months).
- 2. Reaches with one hand.
- 3. Transfers objects from one hand to the other.
- 4. Fear of strangers/separation anxiety.

ACCIDENT PREVENTION:

- 1. *Always* use a car seat. Use a rear facing seat until baby weighs 20 pounds and is at least one year of age.
- 2. Walkers not necessary, can be dangerous around stairs.
- 3. Begin to "childproof" your home. Survey for sharp objects, sharp table edges, medicines and poisons. Obtain lock boxes or install cabinet locks for poison or other dangerous items.
- 4. Block hallways with a safety gate.
- 5. Put electrical outlet covers over all unused outlets.
- 6. Use the playpen as an "island of safety" when needed.
- 7. If you have a swimming pool, make sure it is properly fenced and that the infant is never left unattended near the pool.
- 8. Keep **poison hotline number (1-800-764-7661)** in case of accidental ingestion.

NUTRITION:

- 1. Start on solids, if you haven't already done so.
- 2. Introduce a cup, but don't expect too much too soon.

ILLNESS:

- 1. Acetaminophen drops—0.8 mL (12-17 pounds) / 1.2 mL (18-32 pounds).
- 2. Fever does **not** cause brain damage.

NEXT VISIT:

At nine months of age.
